For this project you will need to produce and present a sewing processes and techniques folder to help inform your work with other projects.

You will need to practice and present finished samples of different sewing processes and techniques that will include:

- Seams and seam finishes
- Different forms of Suppression - Darts, pleats and gathers
- Pockets - surface, in-seam and inserted
- Openings and closures - placket, bound and vented. Also buttons and buttonholes
- Zips - concealed, trouser and exposed
- Finishings - including binding, facings and lining

Each finished sample or process will have clear instructions on how to complete it and any other pertinent information.

You will also create a Swatch Library where you will record any interesting fabrics you find or want to use. The information you record will include:

- Supplier
- Width
- Price
- Fibre content
- Care instructions
- Best suited for

You will also need to clearly identify all the key points on a sewing machine and identify key health and safety issues when creating the samples for the folder.
